NOMINATIONS

In order to nominate an individual to receive the Hall of Fame award, a completed application must be submitted to the United States Police & Fire Championships office in San Diego. Applications are available at the USPFC office. The application must include the following information: the reason the award should be given to the nominee, number of years the nominee has participated/officiated in the Games, records set, accomplishments achieved, short biography of the nominee, and the support the nominee has provided for the Games.

In order for the nominee to be considered for this award, the Hall of Fame application must be received at the USPFC office by November 1st of each year.

ALADS

The Association for Los Angeles Deputy Sheriffs (ALADS) was formed in February, 1970 by ten Deputies. They joined together to collectively resolve a dispute, and quickly recognized a need for a new and separate association for Deputy Sheriffs. Prior to 1970, there was no association controlled by, and operated for, the rank-and-file Deputy. Later ALADS expanded to include the District Attorney Investigators and Deputy Marshals, many of whom were former Deputy Sheriffs.

ALADS has been a proud supporter, and it is with immense pride and in grateful appreciation that we honor ALADS with the Duke Nyhus Award for their long-standing support of the California Police Athletic Federation.
