We are proud to introduce two more inductees into the “Hall Of Fame”, Chuck Foote and Matthew Pruitt. These 2 deserving athletes were honored in Reno and join Duke Nyhus and Bob Burke who were inducted in 2004.

### **Chuck Foote**

- Associate Director – Western States Police and Fire Games
- Competed in his first Games in 1971
- 27 years with the Los Angeles Police Dept. (Retired)
- 1973 began coaching the LAPD track/distance running teams
- 1985, with Larry Moore, created the Baker to Vegas Relay Challenge
- Holds many records in Track & Field events
- 1989 took a job as the Assistant Track/Cross Country coach at Cal-Poly in Pomona, coaching many NCAA All Americans

### **Matthew Pruitt**

- Competed in his first Games in 1969
- 21 years with Oakland Police Dept. (Retired)
- 15 years on BART PD (Retired)
- Holds many records in Track and Field events
- 2003 ranked 3<sup>rd</sup> in the nation by USA Track & Field in the 400 meters
- 2004 ranked 4<sup>th</sup> in the nation by USA Track & Field in the 400 meters

### **Duke Nyhus**

- Executive Director – California Police Athletic Federation
- Founder of the first Police Olympics in 1967
- Won numerous medals in Archery
- Executive Board since 1968
- Retired San Diego Police Department

### **Bob Burke**

- Former Treasurer – California Police Athletic Federation
- Athletic Director – Los Angeles Police Department for over 20 years
- Organizer/member of the World Record relay team, running from L.A. to Washington D.C.
- Competed in Biathlon, Cross Country, Decathlon, Pentathlon, Powerlifting, Track & Field, and shooting events in both the World and State Games
- Established National records in NRA Match Course in .45 Service Pistol, .22 Automatic, .38 Revolver and .45 Revolver
