Individuals who consistently exhibit good sportsmanship, camaraderie and the overall excellence in their professions are being inducted into our “Hall of Fame”.

We are proud to introduce four more inductees into the “Hall Of Fame”: John Rogers, Bill Hartmann, Candelario Lopez and Lawrence Albrecht. These 4 deserving athletes were honored during the 2006 WSPFG held in San Diego.

John Rogers

- Competed in his first Games in 1968
- Has competed in every Games since 1968
- Has amassed hundreds of swimming medals
- Competed on an unbeaten LAPD Water Polo Team
- Competed in Track events between Swimming events
- Helped to officiate TCA and the Baker to Vegas Relay
- Retired from LAPD in 1995
- Served as Chief of Police in Lake Forest Park, WA for 5½ years
- LAPD recognized John as ‘Swimmer of the Year’ “Water Polo Player of the Year’ and ‘Athlete of the Decade (1980-1990)

Bill Hartmann

- Holds all California Police Athletic Federation Powerlifting Records in the Grand Master 275.5 LB. and 242.5 Lb. Classes
- Multi year U.S. Master’s Champion in the 242.5 Lb. Class
- 26 year veteran of the LAPD retiring in 1980 as a Lieutenant
- USPF National and IPF World Master’s record holder
- 1st 60 year old competitor to dead lift over 700 Lbs.(733 Lbs.) in 1992
- Officiated for the CPAF for more than 30 years
- He is an IPF Category 1 Referee/ past Chairman of the IPF Technical Committee
- Inducted into LAPD’s Hall of Fame in 1990
- Inducted in the California Powerlifting Hall of Fame in 2004
- Licensed pilot volunteering through Civil Air Patrol flying Search and Rescue Mission for the Air Force Auxiliary

- Record of 18 WINS and 0 Losses in Boxing
- Holds 8 California Police Games Titles
- Holds 1 International Police Games title
- Holds 1 World Police and Fire Games title
- 29 year veteran of the San Jose Police Department
- Boxing Coordinator for the 1st World Police and Fire Games in 1985
- Boxing Coordinator for the 2001 California Police and Fire Games
- Has coached the San Jose PD Boxing Team since 1980
- Coached Amateur Boxing with the San Jose P.A.L. program since 1977
- One of the USA Olympic Boxing Team Coaches for the 2000 Olympic Games
- Member of San Jose PD Soccer team for 10 years

Lawrence (Larry) A. Albrecht

- Currently holds all Archery Barebow records in the California Police Olympics
- Currently holds all Barebow records in the California Police Summer Games
- Currently holds all Barebow records in the California Police and Fire Games
- Currently holds all Barebow records in the World Police and Fire Games
- Currently holds all Barebow records in the International Police Olympics
- Retired from Los Angeles Police Department
- Competed in most of the Games including the first one held in 1967
- He uses no aiming or release devices when he shoots
- Coached the LAPD Archery Team
- Coached underprivileged youngsters while with LAPD as well as youth groups
