Individuals who consistently exhibit good sportsmanship, camaraderie and the overall excellence in their professions are being inducted into our "Hall of Fame".

We honor Robert A. Buckman and Lawrence (Larry) J. Moore as our latest inductees.

Robert A. Buckman - 2007

- Competed in his first Games in 1969.
- Has 81 medals, all but 2 medals have been for Track & Field
- Has set 4 records during his participation
- Graduated from Sacramento State University with a B.A. in Police Science and Administration
- Sworn in as Deputy Sheriff in 1961, promoted to Sergeant in 1968 and retired in 1992

Lawrence (Larry) J. Moore - 2007

- Competed in his first Games in 1967
- Created the TCA (Toughest Competitor Alive) competition
- Became a member of the CPAF Board of Directors in 1984
- Has set numerous records in swimming
- Was an All American Water-Polo player in college
- Competed on an unbeaten LAPD Water Polo Team
- Was the second Athletic Director for LAPD
- In 1985, with Chuck Foote, created the Baker to Vegas Relay Challenge
- Retired from LAPD in 1995 after 31 years of service
