Jonna Wiltshire – 2010 – First woman to be inducted into the Hall of Fame

- > Was the Operations Director for the very successful 2007 Games held in Santa Clarita
- Participated in the Games as an competitor and official from 1981-2000
- > Has competed in Powerlifting, Bench Press, Tug-of-War, Softball and TCA
- Served for over 28 years, first with the Los Angeles Co Marshal's Department and now with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department
- > She has competed in and been "support" to the Baker to Vegas Relay numerous times
- Has held Bench Press training seminars for Department Units and assisted as a judge at LAPD's Bench Press competitions
- Has won Gold and set records in the Western States Police and Fire Games and the World Police and Fire Games in Bench Press, Powerlifting and TCA events

Allan G. Brown - 2010

- > Began his career in law enforcement in 1962 with the Tustin Police Department
- > Worked for the Orange Police Department and joined the Orange Co Marshal's office in 1984
- Retired in 2003 after 31 years of service
- His first competition was in the California Police Olympics in 1968 in Orange County
- His specialty is Track and Field and particularly enjoys the Discus and Hammer
- > Has earned over 100 medals
- Has set 18 records, 5 of which still stand
- > One time member of the Southern California Striders Track Club and in 1988 was awarded the "Outstanding Field Athlete of the Year" award
- > He is involved in coaching younger athletes and hopes to coach soon at a high school in his home town of Prescott, Arizona

John Lee - 2010

- Began his career in law enforcement in 1977 and is a member of the Los Angeles Co Sheriff's Department
- > Has competed in our Games for 26 years
- Competed in 10 other Games including the World Police and Fire Games, International Police Games, Can-Am Games, California and North American Winter Games and several state Games
- He has won 210 medals in sports which include Cycling, Karate, Boxing, Triathlon, Biathlon, Pentathlon, Pistol (PPC and Police Action) and several others
- Was the National Police Shooting Champion in the Master Class in 1984 and the Expert class in 2007
- He is co-holder of PPC Shooting records in California, Nevada (Match 1), Canada (Match 2) and a NRA National record holder (Match 1)
- > He coordinated the Biathlon event when the Games were in Los Angeles in 1993 and also in 2000 in San Bernardino
