OFFICIALS

One umpire is suggested during the semi-final and final matches.

During the preliminary matches, competitors may fulfill these duties, except when the matches involve another competitor from the same team or agency or any other known conflict.

BRACKETING

Pool play of 4 person/team groupings followed by a Double Elimination Tournament. The top two in each pool will advance to the "A" Flight and the bottom two will advance to the "B" Flight. Medals will be awarded to both Flights.

With this type of tournament in play, each player/team will be guaranteed four matches.

SCHEDULING

Doubles will be played on Day One of the event in its entirety.

Singles will be played on Day Two of the event in its entirety.

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SCORING

- **Traditional 21:** The game is played to the pre-determined number of twenty-one (21) points. The first player/team to reach or exceed, that amount at the conclusion of a frame is the winner. Games will be limited to fifteen (15) minutes. Player/team ahead at the conclusion of the 15 minutes will be declared the winner.
- **Frame:** A frame consists of a player pitching their four bags from one board to another. Players must pitch all four bags from the same side of the board in a frame.
- **Foul Bags:** Refers to any bag that has not been determined as a “woody” or “cornhole”, or was designated a foul bag as the result of a rules violation. Bags contacting the ground before reaching the playing surface and bags pitched when a player has crossed the foul line are Foul Bags. If a foul bag lands on the playing surface or comes to rest touching the ground and the board, it must be removed immediately.
- **Raking:** If bags become piled inside the cornhole board and may interfere or obstruct the next pitch, or if there is a question whether a cornhole bag would have naturally fallen through the hole, a player may request to “rake” the cornhole bags that have fallen inside the hole.
- **Cancellation Scoring:** The approved method of scoring for the sport of cornhole is “cancellation” scoring. In cancellation scoring, the points of one player/team cancel out the points of their opponent. Using this method, only one player/team can score in each frame.
 - Woody: Each woody is worth one (1) point
 - Cornhole: Each cornhole is worth three (3) points
 - Example:
 - Red achieves one (1) woody and two (2) cornholes
 - Blue achieves two (2) woodies and zero (0) cornholes
 - 7 points -2 points=Red scores 5 points for that frame

GENERAL SPORTS RULES for Cornhole

Doubles Play:

- Team A competes against Team B (each team is comprised of two (2) people).
- Each team will stay in their designated lane for the whole game.
- Players at the headboard will alternate pitching bags until each player has pitched all four (4) of their bags.
- Players at the footboard will take score and resume pitching back to the other cornhole board.

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AWARDS

A maximum of 6 sets of medals (1st through 3rd place) will be required. USPFC will advise you of the number of sets needed based on total entries, plus a reasonable margin.
